CONCUSSION RECOGNITION TOOL 5®

To help identify concussion in children, adolescents and adults











RECOGNISE & REMOVE

Head impacts can be associated with serious and potentially fatal brain injuries. The Concussion Recognition Tool 5 (CRT5) is to be used for the identification of suspected concussion. It is not designed to diagnose concussion.

STEP 1: RED FLAGS - CALL AN AMBULANCE

If there is concern after an injury including whether ANY of the following signs are observed or complaints are reported then the player should be safely and immediately removed from play/game/activity. If no licensed healthcare professional is available, call an ambulance for urgent medical assessment:

- Neck pain or tenderness
- Double vision
- Weakness or tingling/ burning in arms or legs
- Severe or increasing headache
- Seizure or convulsion
- Loss of consciousness
- Deteriorating conscious state
- Vomiting
- Increasingly restless, agitated or combative

Remember:

- In all cases, the basic principles of first aid (danger, response, airway, breathing, circulation) should be followed.
- Assessment for a spinal cord injury is critical.
- · Do not attempt to move the player (other than required for airway support) unless trained to so do.
- · Do not remove a helmet or any other equipment unless trained to do so safely.

If there are no Red Flags, identification of possible concussion should proceed to the following steps:

STEP 2: OBSERVABLE SIGNS

Visual clues that suggest possible concussion include:

- Lying motionless on the playing surface
- Slow to get up after a direct or indirect hit to the head
- Disorientation or confusion, or an inability to respond appropriately to questions
- · Blank or vacant look
- Balance, gait difficulties, motor incoordination, stumbling, slow laboured movements
- Facial injury after head trauma

STEP 3: SYMPTOMS

- Headache
- Blurred vision
- More emotional More Irritable

Sadness

Nervous or

anxious

Neck Pain

- "Pressure in head"
 - Sensitivity to light
- Balance problems
- Nausea or vomiting
- Drowsiness
- Dizziness
- Sensitivity to noise
- Fatigue or low energy
- "Don't feel right"

- - Difficulty concentrating
 - Difficulty remembering
 - Feeling slowed down
 - Feeling like "in a fog"

STEP 4: MEMORY ASSESSMENT

(IN ATHLETES OLDER THAN 12 YEARS)

Failure to answer any of these questions (modified appropriately for each sport) correctly may suggest a concussion:

- · "What venue are we at today?"
- "Which half is it now?"
- "Who scored last in this game?"
- "What team did you play last week/game?"
- "Did your team win the last game?"

Athletes with suspected concussion should:

- Not be left alone initially (at least for the first 1-2 hours).
- Not drink alcohol.
- Not use recreational/ prescription drugs.
- Not be sent home by themselves. They need to be with a responsible adult.
- Not drive a motor vehicle until cleared to do so by a healthcare professional.

The CRT5 may be freely copied in its current form for distribution to individuals, teams, groups and organisations. Any revision and any reproduction in a digital form requires approval by the Concussion in Sport Group. It should not be altered in any way, rebranded or sold for commercial gain.

ANY ATHLETE WITH A SUSPECTED CONCUSSION SHOULD BE IMMEDIATELY REMOVED FROM PRACTICE OR PLAY AND SHOULD NOT RETURN TO ACTIVITY UNTIL ASSESSED MEDICALLY, EVEN IF THE SYMPTOMS RESOLVE

Emergency

In the event of an emergency an air horn will be sounded with 6 long bursts repeated every 5 minutes.

Assembly areas

Assemble at group campsite and await instructions from camp staff Camp Emergency Alarm activation assigned to Camp Chief.

Severe weather

- In the event of extreme weather conditions (i.e. flooding, high winds) the camp chief will advise campers to seek appropriate shelter in the wet weather shelter or other suitable accommodation.
- In the event of extreme heat some activities may be stopped due to the risk of heat stroke/

dehydration.

Lost youth members

- Cub section leaders will take a headcount. The camp chief will detail search parties under the
- supervision of appropriate staff.

Fire

- In the event of a fire Cub section leaders will evacuate campers to an assembly point in the main campsite. If it is safe to do so small fires may be tackled
- by suitably trained staff. Emergency services will be called by camp chief if required.

Intruders

- If a stranger enters camp the Camp chief should be notified immediately. Unless the stranger poses an obvious threat, they may be approached and asked to identify themselves. If they fail to do so the Gardai should be called immediately. If an extreme danger is suspected then the emergency alert will be given.

Serious illness or injury

- Illnesses or injuriés may be dealt with by suitably trained First Aid personnel within the scope of
- their expertise. Order of Malta staff will be on site during daytime programme activities. If expert
- medical care is required then responsible scouters should call for emergency services or remove
- casualty to the local hospital as required. Cub section leaders must keep a log of all accidents and
- incidents.

Rules

- ACTION Please let Cubs know about the rules in advance.
- No Alcohol
- No Mobile Phones
- No Pen Knives
- No Flint & Steel
- No Water Balloons
- Quiet time 2300 0700.
- Cubs making noise during the quiet time, will need to be monitored by Scouters.
- If complaints are made by other Groups and this continues, we may need to request that the Cubs parents/guardian is called.
- Scouters to ID their Tent. (tie on a high viz)

Waste Disposal

- Portlick Campsite requires each group to ensure they adhere to the campsites waste management system.
- Each group should have provision on site for 4 types of waste. Just like at home.......
 - Recycling: this is for all recyclable waste except glass. All cardboard, cleaned plastic, paper etc. should be disposed of in this bin.
 - General Waste: this will contain sisal and any other types of waste that is not catered for elsewhere.
 - Organic Waste: this will contain all food waste.
 - Glass: all glass needs to be washed out before being placed in the glass bin.
- Each group should have 2 rubbish bins/bags, one recycling and one general.
- Each group should ideally have a bucket with handle for their organic waste. These buckets should be lined with a bag (preferably compostable).
- Please encourage Cubs to become familiar with waste management on camp.
- Waste water to be placed in sinks. No fat .No food pieces to be left in the sink clean up after yourself.

 - a. Radio to Site, Scouters to come and pickup Cubs.
- Van/Jeep allowed on site . Speed to a minimum.
- No other Cars allowed on site unless towing a trailer.
- All vehicles off site ASAP Can then park in Car Park near site.
- On Sunday, no vehicles allowed on site until 1030 (Break Camp)





 - Must be Garda Vetted if over 16
 - No hammock camping
 - · Can camp in separate field
- Backup Plan –We do have the use of "Wet Weather Shelter" should inclement Weather take hold. We will discuss in next meetings about "Plan B", which hasn't had to be used yet.. Last year, Groups had Board Games, Quiz questions as a backup.
- **ACTION** Please have each Group prepare a set of 10 questions (Re their theme) for use at Quiz in the event of inclement weather
- ACTION Please bring some board games, again for the same purpose
- Food Storage
- · There are fridges and freezers on-site. Your freezer blocks should be labelled with a Permanent Marker.

 - Cubs need to be warm. Tshirt at least (to wear under LifeVest)
 - Cubs to have Swimming Gear on ready for the session
